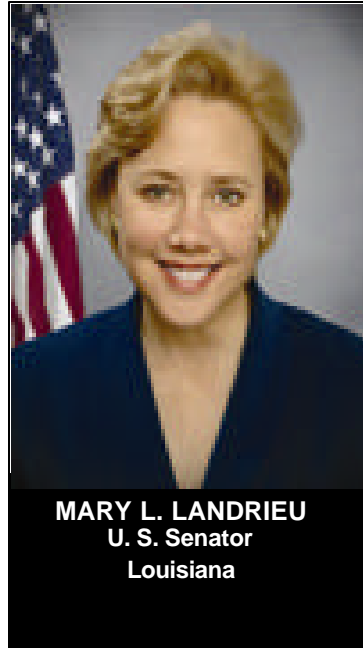
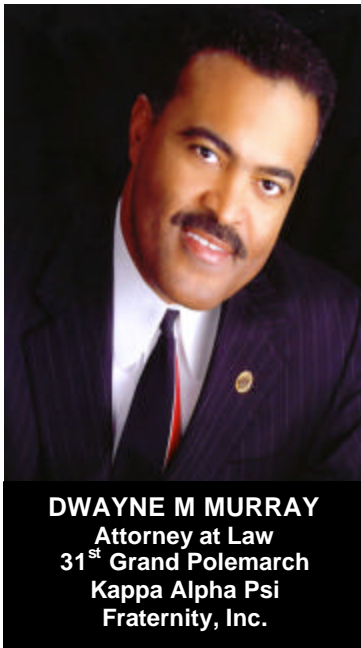

31st Grand Polemarch Feted at Inaugural Celebration

U. S. States Senator Honored as Chapter Humanitarian of the Year

Dwayne M. Murray, Esq., the newly elected 31st Grand Polemarch of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., was feted at an Inaugural Celebration in his hometown, Baton Rouge, Louisiana on the weekend of August 3-4, 2007.

This gala was hosted by the Baton Rouge Alumni Chapter, which proudly seized the opportunity to call itself “the Flagship chapter” of Kappa Alpha Psi.

The celebration began on Friday, August 3rd with a gala reception at the Camelot Club in downtown Baton Rouge. It was attended by an array of politicians, business persons, and presenters from various organizations, including the NPHC Greek fraternities and sororities, the host chapter, Baton Rouge Alumni and many distinguished guests.

The highlight of the event was the keynote address by the Honorable Mary L. Landrieu, senior Senator of Louisiana, who applauded the work of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, and noted numerous parallels to the work she is doing at the federal level to meet the needs of our constituency.

As the first female U S. Senator from Louisiana, she has become a legend throughout the nation, speaking up for citizens everywhere, and challenging other government officials for their inaction in the Gulf Coast tragedies, as well as the weak-



nesses in Homeland Security. Senator Landrieu was so impressed with our initiatives, as well as our Grand Polemarch, that she donated \$500 to Kappa Alpha Psi in support of our St. Jude Hospital initiative.

In his closing remarks, Grand Polemarch Murray emphasized the need for Kappa Alpha Psi to things that are “significant.” He continued to speak about COMMITMENT and dedication to youth programs, including his “Listening Tour,” that was launched in Baton Rouge during the weekend, featuring a youth panel discussing public issues and offering solutions.

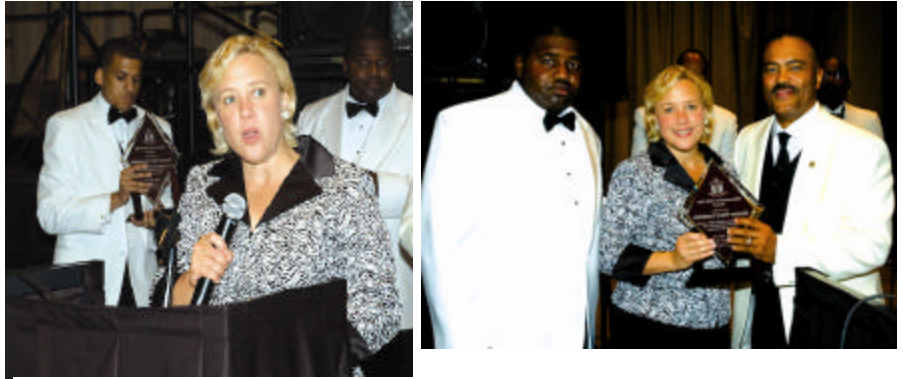
During the weekend, the CARE
